1 WHEREAS, The first female ever to serve as an appellate judge 2 in the State of Texas, Judge Mary Lou Robinson of Amarillo has 3 benefited her fellow citizens with diligence and skill for the past 4 five decades, and it is indeed fitting to reflect on this dedicated 5 jurist's exemplary tenure on the bench; and

6 WHEREAS, Judge Robinson attended Amarillo College and 7 received her undergraduate and law degrees at The University of 8 Texas; she began her legal career in Austin in 1949 and returned the 9 following year to Amarillo, where she continued in private 10 practice; and

11 WHEREAS, In 1955, she was appointed judge of the newly 12 created Potter County Court at Law, beginning the first of many 13 judgeships she would hold over the course of her career; and

WHEREAS, Since that time, she has also served as judge of the 15 108th District Court of Potter County, associate justice and then 16 chief justice of the Court of Civil Appeals for the Seventh Supreme 17 Judicial District, and United States District Judge for the 18 Northern District of Texas, Amarillo Division; and

WHEREAS, Judge Robinson has brought to each of these positions her characteristic intelligence and integrity, and the high esteem in which she is held by her professional peers is evident from the many honors she has been accorded, including the Texas Center for Legal Ethics Sandra Day O'Connor Award for Professional Excellence, the Texas Bar Foundation Outstanding

Fifty-Year Lawyer Award, and inclusion in a special commemorative edition of *Texas Lawyer* magazine as one of the 100 "Legal Legends" of Texas; and

WHEREAS, A vital presence in the civic life of her hometown,
she has given generously of her time and talent to such worthwhile
institutions as Kairos House, the Rotary Club of Amarillo, the
Amarillo Club of Zonta International, and Westminster Presbyterian
Church; and

9 WHEREAS, Named the 2004 Distinguished Alumna of the Year by 10 Amarillo College, Judge Robinson is also the recipient of the 1998 11 Career Achievement Award from the Amarillo Women's Network and is 12 listed in *Who's Who in America*; and

13 WHEREAS, Those Texans who dedicate themselves to the 14 challenges of public service are truly deserving of our deepest 15 gratitude and admiration, and Mary Lou Robinson's remarkable tenure 16 as a jurist has set a high standard of excellence to which all may 17 aspire; now, therefore, be it

18 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas 19 Legislature, 1st Called Session, hereby honor Judge Mary Lou 20 Robinson for her 50 years of outstanding public service and extend 21 to her sincere best wishes for the future; and, be it further

22 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be 23 prepared for Judge Robinson as an expression of high regard by the 24 Texas House of Representatives.
