2 F. Bradfield, Jr., of The Woodlands suffered an immeasurable loss
3 with the death of this beloved young man on July 9, 2005, at the age
4 of 22; and

5 WHEREAS, A member of the 2nd Squadron, 3rd Armored Cavalry
6 Regiment, Specialist Bradfield was killed while serving his second
7 tour of duty in Operation Iraqi Freedom; and

8 WHEREAS, Notwithstanding the hardships that he faced in a war
9 zone, this brave soldier performed his work with pride and
10 professionalism, and his concern for the well-being of others was
11 truly commendable; and

12 WHEREAS, Our state and our nation are fortunate to have young
13 men and women whose love for their country inspires them to military
14 service, yet the tragic death of this exemplary young American is a
15 sobering reminder of the cost of war; we owe a profound debt to our
16 nation's servicemen and servicewomen, whose valiant efforts and
17 enormous sacrifices are deserving of their fellow citizens' deepest
18 respect and gratitude; and

19 WHEREAS, Beloved husband, son, and brother, Hoby Bradfield
20 will be sorely missed by his family, friends, and fellow soldiers,
21 but his heroism will not be forgotten; now, therefore, be it
