WHEREAS, Blessed with the leadership of many fine individuals throughout its history, Plum Street UMC is shepherded today by the Reverend Iziar Lankford, a valued teacher, counselor, and stalwart friend; and


WHEREAS, Since its founding, Plum Street UMC has served as a haven of hope and support for many members of the Abilene community, and it is a distinct pleasure to honor this steadfast community of faith; now, therefore, be it
