WHEREAS, After his retirement, Mr. Smith embarked on a second career with DSA, a construction management firm specializing in school design and construction; he also became active in the Texas Association of Retired Administrators and served two terms as the association's president; and

WHEREAS, This distinguished Texan devoted much of his time and energy to his community; he was president and director of the Jacksboro Lions Club and the Jacksboro and Cleburne Chambers of
