4 Boston, Massachusetts, on May 16, 2005, with the John F. Kennedy
5 Profile in Courage Award; and

6 WHEREAS, Named for President Kennedy's 1957 Pulitzer
7 Prize-winning book, *Profiles in Courage*, this prestigious award is
8 presented to individuals who demonstrate the courage to make
9 decisions of conscience without regard for the consequences; past
10 recipients of the award include United Nations Secretary-General
11 Kofi Annan, former United States President Gerald Ford, and former
12 United States Congressman Henry B. Gonzalez; and

13 WHEREAS, During his distinguished career in the Texas
14 Legislature, Senator Ratliff was an effective and efficient leader
15 who supported an inclusive style of governing; moreover, he wrote
16 and secured passage of landmark education legislation and was
17 instrumental in improving health insurance and access to Medicaid
18 for Texans; and

19 WHEREAS, Although his record of service alone was sufficient
20 to warrant his selection for this honor by the bipartisan Profile in
21 Courage Award committee, Senator Ratliff received special
22 commendation for his efforts during the state's redistricting
23 process; and

24 WHEREAS, Bill Ratliff has inspired countless Americans with
