## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to a Texas teacher leadership initiative.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 21, Education Code, is amended by adding
5	Subchapter P to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER P. TEXAS TEACHER LEADERSHIP INITIATIVE
7	Sec. 21.751. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
8	(1) "Board" means the State Board for Educator
9	Certification.
10	(2) "Initiative" means the Texas teacher leadership
11	<u>initiative.</u>
12	Sec. 21.752. PURPOSES. The Texas teacher leadership
13	initiative is a beginning teacher mentoring and induction program
14	in which an experienced teacher leader offers mentoring to a
15	beginning teacher. The initiative is designed to:
16	(1) promote excellence in teaching;
17	(2) enhance student achievement;
18	(3) build a supporting environment within school
19	districts;
20	(4) increase the retention of both experienced and
21	beginning teachers; and
22	(5) promote the personal and professional well-being
23	of teachers.
24	Sec. 21.753. ESTABLISHMENT OF INITIATIVE. The State Board

- 1 for Educator Certification by rule shall establish the initiative
- 2 consistent with the purposes provided by Section 21.752. In
- 3 developing the initiative, the board shall establish:
- 4 (1) guidelines for school districts to follow in
- 5 creating a training program for teacher leaders, including
- 6 guidelines relating to:
- 7 (A) necessary skills for classroom demonstration
- 8 and coaching; and
- 9 (B) board expectations for beginning teacher
- 10 competence;
- 11 (2) standards and criteria for evaluating and
- 12 approving school district applications for participation in the
- 13 initiative;
- 14 (3) guidelines for school districts to follow in
- 15 selecting teacher leaders; and
- 16 (4) a reporting requirement for school districts that
- 17 participate in the initiative concerning the effectiveness of the
- 18 initiative in the district.
- 19 Sec. 21.754. SCHOOL DISTRICT PARTICIPATION IN INITIATIVE.
- 20 (a) A school district may apply to the board to participate in the
- 21 <u>initiative</u>. In selecting districts to participate in the
- 22 <u>initiative</u>, the board shall give preference to a district:
- 23 (1) that has an unsatisfactory teacher retention rate;
- 24 (2) that has an unsatisfactory high school graduation
- 25 rate;
- 26 (3) that has an unsatisfactory dropout rate; or
- 27 <u>(4) in which a high percentage of district students</u>

- 1 perform unsatisfactorily on assessment instruments administered
- 2 under Section 39.023.
- 3 (b) To each school district selected to participate in the
- 4 initiative, the board shall provide a grant in an amount determined
- 5 by the board for use by the district in implementing the initiative.
- 6 The district must use the grant in a manner that allows a beginning
- 7 teacher who is selected to participate in the initiative to
- 8 continue participation for at least two school years.
- 9 Sec. 21.755. DISTRICT FACILITATOR. (a) The board of
- 10 <u>trustees of a participating school district shall select a district</u>
- 11 employee to serve as district facilitator of the initiative. The
- 12 district facilitator shall oversee the implementation of the
- 13 initiative in the district.
- 14 (b) The school district may use initiative grant money to
- pay to the district facilitator a stipend.
- Sec. 21.756. NOMINATION PANEL; SELECTION PROCESS FOR
- 17 TEACHER LEADERS. (a) The board of trustees of a participating
- 18 school district shall assemble a nomination panel for selecting
- 19 teacher leaders to participate in the initiative. The panel must be
- 20 composed of an equal number of district administrators and
- 21 teachers, with at least one teacher representing a local teacher's
- 22 association, if such an association exists.
- 23 (b) Any school district employee or parent or guardian of a
- 24 district student may nominate an experienced district teacher to
- 25 serve as a teacher leader. The district shall provide notice of and
- 26 information about the nomination process to district employees and
- 27 the parents or guardians of district students. If an insufficient

- 1 number of teachers are nominated, the panel may nominate
- 2 experienced teachers to serve as teacher leaders. The nomination
- 3 panel shall adopt an application and interview process in selecting
- 4 teacher leaders.
- 5 (c) In selecting a teacher leader, the nomination panel may
- 6 <u>select only a teacher who demonstrates:</u>
- 7 (1) strong pedagogical and subject matter skills;
- 8 (2) superior teaching abilities and interpersonal
- 9 relationship qualities; and
- 10 <u>(3) a proven ability in improving the academic</u>
- 11 performance of educationally disadvantaged students.
- 12 Sec. 21.757. BEGINNING TEACHER PARTICIPATION IN
- 13 <u>INITIATIVE</u>. (a) The district facilitator appointed under Section
- 14 21.755 shall, in coordination with the superintendent of the school
- 15 district and campus principals, select beginning teachers to
- 16 participate in the initiative. The district facilitator may select
- only a beginning teacher who has been teaching for not more than two
- 18 years.
- 19 (b) A participating beginning teacher shall perform
- 20 teaching duties under the guidance of the teacher leader assigned
- 21 to the beginning teacher. The beginning teacher is entitled to
- 22 participate in the initiative for at least two school years.
- 23 (c) A participating beginning teacher shall perform
- instructional and planning duties for not more than 90 percent of
- 25 the teacher's regular workweek so that the teacher may receive
- 26 guidance from a teacher leader.
- 27 (d) A teacher leader may not participate in a school or

- 1 district evaluation of the beginning teacher to whom the teacher
- 2 leader is assigned. Any written or other reports of a teacher
- 3 leader regarding the beginning teacher may not be used in an
- 4 appraisal of a beginning teacher.
- 5 Sec. 21.758. TEACHER LEADER PARTICIPATION IN INITIATIVE.
- 6 (a) The district facilitator appointed under Section 21.755 shall
- 7 <u>assign a teacher leader to one or more participating beginning</u>
- 8 teachers.
- 9 (b) The teacher leader shall assist the beginning teacher
- 10 by:
- 11 (1) observing the beginning teacher's lessons;
- 12 (2) providing feedback and advice to the beginning
- 13 teacher; and
- 14 (3) demonstrating teaching techniques.
- 15 (c) A teacher leader shall either:
- 16 (1) serve as a teacher leader on a part-time basis and
- 17 perform other instructional and planning duties for at least 60
- 18 percent but not more than 90 percent of the teacher's regular
- 19 workweek; or
- 20 (2) serve as a teacher leader on a full-time basis,
- 21 provided that:
- 22 <u>(A) the teacher has consented to serve as a</u>
- 23 full-time teacher leader;
- 24 (B) the teacher leader does not serve as a
- 25 full-time teacher leader for more than two out of five consecutive
- 26 school years; and
- 27 (C) service as a full-time teacher leader does

- 1 <u>not diminish or impair any tenure or seniority rights of the</u>
- 2 teacher.
- 3 <u>(d) To the extent practicable, a part-time teacher leader</u>
- 4 and a beginning teacher to whom the teacher leader has been assigned
- 5 shall share common planning periods.
- 6 (e) The teacher leader shall observe the classroom teaching
- 7 skills of the beginning teacher for at least one hour per week and
- 8 shall meet with the beginning teacher to discuss the beginning
- 9 <u>teacher's performance at least once a week during the first half of</u>
- 10 the first school year that the beginning teacher participates in
- 11 the initiative. The teacher leader may then elect to observe the
- 12 classroom teaching skills of the beginning teacher and meet with
- 13 the beginning teacher at least once every two weeks for the
- 14 remainder of the time the beginning teacher participates in the
- 15 initiative.
- Sec. 21.759. TEACHER LEADER TRAINING. A participating
- 17 school district shall offer an ongoing training program for teacher
- 18 <u>leaders that follows guidelines developed by the board under</u>
- 19 Section 21.753.
- Sec. 21.760. TEACHER LEADER STIPEND. (a) For each school
- 21 year that a teacher serves as a teacher leader, the teacher is
- 22 <u>entitled to a stipend of not more than \$5,000.</u>
- 23 (b) A stipend a teacher receives under this section:
- 24 (1) is in addition to the regular salary to which a
- 25 teacher is otherwise entitled under the district's salary schedule;
- 26 and
- 27 (2) is not considered in determining whether the

- 1 district is paying the teacher the minimum monthly salary under
- 2 Section 21.402.
- 3 Sec. 21.761. EVALUATION OF INITIATIVE. The board shall
- 4 annually evaluate the effectiveness of the initiative in
- 5 participating school districts. The evaluation must consider:
- 6 (1) the performance of participating district
- 7 <u>students on assessment instruments administered under Section</u>
- 8 39.023;
- 9 (2) the high school graduation rate in the
- 10 participating district; and
- 11 (3) the teacher attrition rate in the participating
- 12 district.
- 13 Sec. 21.762. CONTINUED DISTRICT PARTICIPATION IN
- 14 INITIATIVE. A district may reapply with the board for a new grant
- 15 to continue participating in the initiative. The board shall
- 16 consider the improvement of a school district under the factors
- described by Section 21.761 in determining whether to award a new
- 18 grant to the district.
- 19 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 20 of this Act, the State Board for Educator Certification shall
- 21 propose rules for implementing the Texas teacher leadership
- initiative as required by Subchapter P, Chapter 21, Education Code,
- 23 as added by this Act. The State Board for Educator Certification
- 24 shall make the Texas teacher leadership initiative available for
- 25 school district participation not later than the 2006-2007 school
- 26 year.
- 27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 5 legislative session.
