- 2 relating to the remedy provided for failure to disclose certain

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 27.007, Property Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 7 follows:

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- 8 (b) A [If a contract does not contain the notice required by
- 9 this section, the] claimant may recover from the contractor a civil
- 10 penalty of \$500 in addition to any other remedy provided by this
- 11 chapter if:
- 12 (1) the contract does not contain the notice required
- 13 by this section; and
- 14 (2) the claimant proves actual damages were
- 15 proximately caused by the construction defect.
- 16 <u>(c)</u> A court may not certify an action brought under this
- 17 section as a class action.
- 18 SECTION 2. The change in law made by Subsection (b), Section
- 19 27.007, Property Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a
- 20 cause of action that is brought on or after the effective date of
- 21 this Act.
- 22 SECTION 3. The change in law made by Subsection (c), Section
- 23 27.007, Property Code, as added by this Act, applies only to the
- 24 certification of a class action on or after July 1, 2005.

- 1 Certification of a class action before July 1, 2005, is governed by
- 2 the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act,
- 3 and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 9 legislative session.
