WHEREAS, He contributed to the "wall of horns" sound in concerts and recordings of his brothers Alfonso Ramos and Grammy-award-winning Ruben Ramos and the Texas Revolution; he and Alfonso, with their cousin Jesse Mercado and other musicians, provided saxophone while they played legendary rancheras, polkas, and boleros, producing a sound unobtainable with modern electronics; and

WHEREAS, Elijio Ramos will be remembered for his dignity
and his dauntless spirit; and

WHEREAS, Elijio was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather, and he leaves behind memories that will be treasured forever by his family and many friends; now, therefore, be it
