WHEREAS, The spirit and courage of a young man who had found his direction in life showed itself in the way he lived that life, in the way he brought humor and joy to the people around him, and in the way he served his country as an American hero; and

WHEREAS, TJ was a graduate of Cal Farley's Boys Ranch High School; upon joining the army, he was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 64th Armor Regiment, 3rd Infantry Division, Fort Stewart, Georgia; this courageous young soldier was serving his second tour of duty in Iraq with the Desert Rogues; he was killed when his vehicle was hit by mortar fire in Baghdad; and

WHEREAS, TJ earned his Combat Infantryman's Badge at the age of 19 and was with the first division to arrive in Baghdad in the early days of the war in Iraq; he was posthumously awarded the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart; and

WHEREAS, Our state and nation are fortunate to have young men and women whose love for their country inspires them to take up military service; their patriotism serves as an inspiration to all, and their sacrifice is never to be forgotten; and
