HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Texas has long been a leader in recognizing and
- 2 rewarding the tremendous sacrifice of its veterans; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Home ownership in Texas is viewed by many as a
- 4 cherished component of the American Dream; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Enabling Texas veterans to achieve home ownership at
- 6 a lower cost is but a small reward for their faithful service while
- 7 in the U.S. Armed Forces; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In appreciation of this service on behalf of our
- 9 country, the states of Texas, California, Oregon, Alaska, and
- 10 Wisconsin have offered below-market interest rates on home loan
- 11 mortgages for decades; and
- 12 WHEREAS, This program has assisted more than a million
- 13 veterans in obtaining affordable housing and in making a better
- 14 life for themselves and their dependents; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Tax exempt bonds known as Qualified Veterans
- 16 Mortgage Bonds fund the majority of the home purchase and home
- improvement loans made to veterans; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Current federal law governing the use of tax-exempt
- bonds used to fund these loans, as contained in Section 143(I)(4) of
- 20 the Internal Revenue Code, unfairly limits these programs to only
- 21 those veterans who served prior to January 1, 1977; and
- WHEREAS, This restriction unfairly prevents all veterans
- 23 serving on active duty after 1976 from using Qualified Veterans
- 24 Mortgage Bonds, including more than 500,000 men and women who

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- 1 served in Desert Shield and Desert Storm and the 180,000 reservists
- 2 and National Guard members called up to serve our country since
- 3 September 11, 2001; and
- WHEREAS, These courageous men and women are entitled to the
- 5 same benefits offered to their earlier comrades in arms, yet they
- 6 and their families are being denied the opportunity to use
- 7 Qualified Veterans Mortgage Bonds; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Despite the fact that removing the restriction would
- 9 not increase federal discretionary spending, Congress has not yet
- 10 remedied this discriminatory federal provision on behalf of these
- 11 deserving men and women; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the 79th Legislature of the State of Texas,
- 2nd Called Session, hereby respectfully urge the 109th Congress to
- 14 support the American Veterans Home Ownership Act of 2005, to
- 15 immediately remove the aforementioned discriminatory portion of
- 16 the Internal Revenue Code in order that today's veterans and their
- 17 families might enjoy the same benefits as their earlier
- 18 counterparts; and, be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward official
- 20 copies of this resolution to the president of the United States, the
- 21 speaker of the house of representatives, and the president of the
- senate of the United States Congress, and to all the members of the
- 23 Texas delegation to Congress with the request that this resolution
- 24 be officially entered in the Congressional Record as a memorial to
- 25 the Congress of the United States of America.
