

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The observance of National Hispanic Heritage Month
2 dates back to September 17, 1968, when the United States Congress
3 authorized the president to issue an annual proclamation
4 commemorating the enormous contributions made by Hispanic
5 Americans to the development of our nation throughout its rich
6 history; and

7 WHEREAS, Two decades later, on August 17, 1988, the 100th
8 Congress passed a law designating the 31-day period beginning
9 September 15 and ending October 15 as National Hispanic Heritage
10 Month; and

11 WHEREAS, While the impact of Hispanic culture has long been
12 manifest in American customs and traditions, Latinos continue to
13 play increasingly critical roles in the U.S. economy, military, and
14 government; their wide-ranging efforts are reflected in the theme
15 that distinguishes this year's annual observance--Hispanic
16 Americans: Strong and Colorful Threads in the American Fabric; and

17 WHEREAS, During National Hispanic Heritage Month, 2005, the
18 United States Army Medical Command officially acknowledges and
19 celebrates the great diversity of the Hispanic community, its
20 outstanding contributions to the building of this nation, and its
21 steadfast commitment to the high ideals that still unite us as a
22 people; now, therefore, be it
