- 14 Governor William P. Clements from 1979 to 1983 and also in 1987;

- 17 the Texas Employment Commission; and
- WHEREAS, He served as chief of staff of the General Staff of
- 19 the Confederate Air Force in Midland, and he was on the McDonald
- 20 Observatory Board of Visitors for more than 20 years; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Mr. Kaster was also active in Lions International
- 22 and dedicated countless hours to the El Paso Downtown Lions Club and
- 23 the Austin Founders Lions Club, which he served as president, and he
- 24 went on to hold the position of district governor; the organization
