1 WHEREAS, Texas A&M University is committed to increasing
2 diversity among its students, staff, and faculty; and

3 WHEREAS, Texas A&M University has worked to fulfill this
4 commitment through enhanced recruitment, retention, and enrollment
5 strategies; and

6 WHEREAS, Hispanics are the youngest and fastest growing
7 ethnic community in the State of Texas; and

8 WHEREAS, Texas A&M University and the National Hispanic
9 Institute--a widely respected, Texas-based organization--have
10 partnered to provide outreach to Hispanic students by hosting the
11 Young Leaders Conference--Great Debate on July 21-24, 2005; and

13 provide high-achieving Hispanic high school and college students
14 with key learning experiences that help to prepare them for
