18 WHEREAS, After graduating from law school, this esteemed 19 Texan received a Reginald Heber Smith Fellowship and served as an 20 attorney with the Legal Aid Society of Louisville, Kentucky; 21 eventually he entered private practice in Houston, and maintained 22 membership in several professional organizations, including the 23 State Bar of Texas, the National Bar Association, the American Bar 24 Association, and the Houston Lawyer's Association, which he served

WHEREAS, A dedicated member of his community, Reverend 2 Barksdale currently contributes his time as a volunteer for the 3 Houston Independent School District; he has received numerous 4 5 honors for his professional and civic accomplishments and was named a Man on the Move in the 90s by Sigma Gamma Rho Society, Inc., 6 7 Outstanding Minister by the Sugar Valley chapter of the Top Ladies of Distinction, Inc., and Houston Man of the Year by Inspire Women; 8 9 and

WHEREAS, In his role as pastor of FWMBC, Reverend Barksdale 10 has incorporated many new ministries, including a mentorship 11 program, a community awareness committee, a young adult ministry, 12 and a computer literacy ministry, to name but a few; he has also 13 cooperated with nine area churches to build two new homes for 14 15 families in need and has secured the construction of new classrooms, a multipurpose center, 16 and a library and the 17 implementation of a website for the church; and
