

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 40

Bond Davis

**WHEREAS**, The Senate of the State of Texas joins the citizens of San Antonio in mourning the loss of Bond Davis, who died July 6, 2005, at the age of 90; and

**WHEREAS**, A native of San Antonio, Bond Davis was born on April 3, 1915, to Mary Bond and Franklin Coley Davis; he graduated from Jefferson High School, The University of Texas at Austin, and The University of Texas School of Law; and

**WHEREAS**, He proudly served as a navigator in the United States Army Air Corps for five years during World War II and retired with the rank of major; he developed friendships during his military service that he maintained throughout his life; and

**WHEREAS**, After working for the district attorney, Bond practiced law with his father before joining the firm of Gresham, Davis, Gregory, Worthy and Moore; he was the city attorney for Alamo Heights for nine years; and

**WHEREAS**, A devout Christian, Bond was a longtime member of the First Presbyterian Church, where he served as a deacon, an elder, and a trustee and taught in the church school; and

**WHEREAS**, He generously devoted his time and energy to fraternal and community organizations and served on the board of directors of a number of them, including the Children's Service Bureau, Harry Jersig Speech and Hearing Center, and the Young Men's Christian Association; and

**WHEREAS**, He was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather, and he leaves behind memories that will be treasured forever by his family and many friends; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, That the Senate of the State of Texas, 79th Legislature, 2nd Called Session, hereby extend sincere condolences to the bereaved family of Bond Davis: his devoted wife of 54 years, Olive Falvey Davis; his daughters and sons-in-law, Carol Davis West and David West, Mary Davis Wilde and Stephen Wilde, and Hallie Dans Doyle and Michael Doyle; his son, Reagan Hunter Davis; his brother, Franklin C. Davis, Jr.; and his five grandchildren; and, be it further
