1 the purposes of the trust; [and [(C) under Section 113.060 to a beneficiary 2 described by Paragraph (A) that is 25 years of age or older; ] or 3 the power of a court, in the interest of justice, 4 5 to take action or exercise jurisdiction, including the power to: (A) modify or terminate a trust or take other 6 action under Section 112.054; 7 8 (B) remove a trustee under Section 113.082; exercise jurisdiction under Section 115.001; 9 10 (D) require, dispense with, modify, or terminate a trustee's bond; or 11 12 (E) adjust or deny a trustee's compensation if the trustee commits a breach of trust. 13 14 (c) The terms of a trust may not limit any common-law duty to 15 keep a beneficiary of an irrevocable trust who is 25 years of age or older informed at any time during which the beneficiary: 16 17 (1) is entitled or permitted to receive distributions from the trust; or 18 19 (2) would receive a distribution from the trust if the trust were terminated.
