H.B. No. 111

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to certain supplemental state appropriations for deferred
3 payments.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. A reference in this Act to a
6 numbered strategy is a reference to the numbered strategy for the
7 appropriate agency in Chapter 1369, Acts of the 79th Legislature,
8 Regular Session, 2005 (the General Appropriations Act).

9 SECTION 2. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION:
10 APPROPRIATION FOR MEDICAID MANAGED CARE. In addition to amounts
11 previously appropriated for this purpose for the state fiscal
12 biennium ending August 31, 2007, the following amounts are
13 appropriated to the Health and Human Services Commission under
14 Strategy B.1.4, Children and Medically Needy, for the state fiscal
15 year ending August 31, 2007, for the purpose of providing services
16 under the state Medicaid program:

17 (1) the amount of \$52,700,000 out of the general
18 revenue fund; and

19 (2) the amount of \$81,900,000 in federal matching
20 funds.

21 SECTION 3. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION:
22 APPROPRIATION FOR CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM. In addition
23 to amounts previously appropriated for this purpose for the state
24 fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2007, the following amounts are

1 appropriated to the Health and Human Services Commission under
2 Strategy C.1.1, CHIP, for the state fiscal year ending August 31,
3 2007, for the purpose of providing services related to the
4 Children's Health Insurance Program:

5 (1) the amount of \$5,000,000 out of the general
6 revenue fund; and

7 (2) the amount of \$12,900,000 in federal matching
8 funds.

9 SECTION 4. DEPARTMENT OF AGING AND DISABILITY SERVICES:
10 APPROPRIATION FOR MENTAL RETARDATION COMMUNITY SERVICES. (a) In
11 addition to amounts previously appropriated for this purpose for
12 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2007, the amount of
13 \$5,300,000 is appropriated to the Department of Aging and
14 Disability Services under Strategy A.4.3, Mental Retardation
15 Community Services, out of the general revenue fund for the state
16 fiscal year ending August 31, 2007, for the purpose of providing
17 payments to mental retardation community centers.

18 (b) In addition to amounts previously appropriated for this
19 purpose for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2007, the
20 amount of \$200,000 is appropriated to the Department of Aging and
21 Disability Services under Strategy A.4.4, Mental Retardation
22 Community Services Residential, out of the general revenue fund for
23 the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2007, for the purpose of
24 providing payments to mental retardation community centers.

25 SECTION 5. DEPARTMENT OF AGING AND DISABILITY SERVICES:
26 APPROPRIATION FOR VARIOUS SERVICES. In addition to amounts
27 previously appropriated for these purposes for the state fiscal

1 biennium ending August 31, 2007, the amount of \$140,000,000 is
2 appropriated to the Department of Aging and Disability Services out
3 of the general revenue fund and the amount of \$220,800,000 in
4 federal matching funds is appropriated to that agency. The
5 appropriations made under this section are for the state fiscal
6 year ending August 31, 2007, for the purpose of providing long-term
7 care services under the following strategies:

- 8 (1) A.2.1, Primary Home Care;
- 9 (2) A.2.2, Community Attendant Services;
- 10 (3) A.2.3, Day Activity and Health Services;
- 11 (4) A.3.1, Community-Based Alternatives;
- 12 (5) A.3.2, Home and Community-Based Services;
- 13 (6) A.3.3, Community Living Assistance (CLASS);
- 14 (7) A.6.1, Nursing Facility Payments;
- 15 (8) A.6.2, Medicare Skilled Nursing Facility;
- 16 (9) A.6.3, Hospice;
- 17 (10) A.6.4, Promoting Independence Services; and
- 18 (11) A.7.1, Intermediate Care Facilities - Mental
19 Retardation.

20 SECTION 6. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES:
21 FOSTER CARE PAYMENTS. In addition to amounts previously
22 appropriated for this purpose for the state fiscal biennium ending
23 August 31, 2007, the following amounts are appropriated to the
24 Department of Family and Protective Services under Strategy A.2.10,
25 Foster Care Payments, for the state fiscal year ending August 31,
26 2007, for the purpose of making foster care payments for the month
27 of August:

1 (1) the amount of \$12,400,000 out of the general
2 revenue fund;

3 (2) the amount of \$11,600,000 in federal matching
4 funds; and

5 (3) the amount of \$10,300,000 in federal Temporary
6 Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funds.

7 SECTION 7. TEXAS EDUCATION AGENCY: FOUNDATION SCHOOL
8 PROGRAM ENTITLEMENT PAYMENTS. (a) In addition to amounts
9 previously appropriated for this purpose for the state fiscal
10 biennium ending August 31, 2007, the amount of \$800,000,000 is
11 appropriated out of General Revenue Account No. 193 (Foundation
12 School Fund) to the Texas Education Agency for the state fiscal year
13 ending August 31, 2007, for the purpose of making yearly
14 entitlement payments as prescribed by Section 42.259, Education
15 Code.

16 (b) This section takes effect only if an Act of the 79th
17 Legislature:

18 (1) amends Section 42.259, Education Code, to require
19 that the last payment of yearly entitlement payments to category 2
20 and category 3 school districts made under that section be made in
21 August of the calendar year after the calendar year in which the
22 first payment is made; and

23 (2) becomes law in time to require an entitlement
24 payment to those school districts in August 2007.

25 SECTION 8. REPEALER. The following riders to Chapter 1369,
26 Acts of the 79th Legislature, Regular Session, 2005 (the General
27 Appropriations Act), are repealed:

1 (1) Rider 66 following the appropriations to the
2 Health and Human Services Commission;

3 (2) Rider 21 following the appropriations to the
4 Department of Aging and Disability Services;

5 (3) Rider 48 following the appropriations to the
6 Department of Aging and Disability Services; and

7 (4) Rider 25 following the appropriations to the
8 Department of Family and Protective Services.

9 SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
10 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
11 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
12 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
13 immediate effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
14 last day of the legislative session.
