## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, After nearly 23 years of exemplary service with the 2 United States Border Patrol, Hector Trevino of Zapata retired on 3 April 2, 2006, and this occasion presents a fitting opportunity to 4 recognize this dedicated individual; and

5 WHEREAS, Born in Eagle Pass, Agent Trevino graduated from 6 Eagle Pass High School before joining the U.S. Marine Corps in 1972; 7 during his tenure in the corps, he worked as a marine security guard 8 at the American embassies in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, and Montevideo, 9 Uruguay; and

10 WHEREAS, Before joining the border patrol in 1983, Agent 11 Trevino gained valuable experience in law enforcement as an officer 12 with the Texas Department of Corrections and the Kingsville Police 13 Department; those years were also spent pursuing educational 14 opportunities, including an associate's degree in criminal justice 15 from Georgia Military College and a bachelor of science degree in 16 criminal justice from Corpus Christi State University; and

WHEREAS, Agent Trevino's first assignment with the border 17 18 patrol was the Chula Vista Station of the Chula Vista Sector; after graduating from the U.S. Border Academy in Glynco, Georgia, as one 19 of the top three trainee agents in his class, he began a successful 20 21 career that saw him rise steadily through the ranks and earn numerous promotions and commendations for his outstanding 22 23 performance, most notably during his extended tenure at the Zapata 24 station; and
