HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Chief Petty Officer James A. Spiller of Austin
 retired from the United States Navy Reserve on March 4, 2006, after
 22 years of service to his country; and

WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan joined the Navy Reserve in 1965 as a young man, not yet 20 years of age; eager to work with planes, he left the navy for the air force later that year and soon transferred from reserve to active duty; by the time of his honorable discharge four years later, he had toured Thailand, served temporary duty in Vietnam, and risen to the rank of staff sergeant; and

11 WHEREAS, Years later, SKC Spiller's interest in military 12 service was renewed when he discovered that a coworker was 13 traveling to Hawaii as a member of the Navy Reserve; joining the 14 reserves in 1988 at age 41, he followed in the footsteps of his 15 father, George Spiller, who, in his early 40s, also returned to the 16 armed forces as a navy reservist; and

WHEREAS, At the time he rejoined the reserves, James Spiller 17 18 could not have imagined his commitment would span 18 years and take him to such faraway places as Germany, Guam, and Bahrain, or that he 19 would be called on to participate in both the Gulf War and the 20 21 Global War on Terrorism; recognized numerous times for his bravery and skill, he was awarded the Navy Commendation Medal, the Navy 22 23 Achievement Medal, and more; his promotion to chief petty officer 24 was especially memorable as his father, also a naval chief, was

1 there to pin on his new insignia; and

2 WHEREAS, Supporting and augmenting active-duty troops, 3 reservists are an integral and vital part of the U.S. Navy, and SKC 4 James Spiller's generous contributions to his country are most 5 deserving of his fellow citizens' deepest respect and gratitude; 6 now, therefore, be it
