Canfield on September 20, 1935, and 7 proudly served his country in the U.S. Navy during the Korean War; 8 in 1954, he honored a promise made to his mother by becoming the 9 first member of his family to graduate from high school, and he went 10 on to earn a bachelor's degree in metallurgical engineering from 11 12 the University of Illinois, as well as a master's in business administration from The University of Texas at Tyler; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Mr. Canfield's 27-year career in the steel industry took him to Brackenridge, Pennsylvania, and Syracuse, New York, 15 before he eventually settled in Longview, where he was employed by 16 Lone Star Steel; this self-motivated and energetic individual set 17 18 out on his own in 1986, establishing several entrepreneurial enterprises related to the production of steel, including the Plum 19 Group, the Thermo Tech Company, Canfield Engineering, Inc., and 20 21 Canfield & Associates; and 22 WHEREAS, A man of strong faith with an abiding commitment to his family, Mr. Canfield attended Oakland Heights Baptist Church 23 for many years; he was active with the Republican Party since 1958 24 and assumed numerous leadership roles on the local and state 25
