RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Words cannot adequately express the heartache felt 2 at the loss of Officer Brian Howard Jackson, a highly valued member 3 of the Dallas Police Department who died in the line of duty on 4 November 13, 2005, at the age of 28; and

5 WHEREAS, Assigned to a patrol group in central Dallas, 6 Officer Jackson had been helping homicide detectives to pursue 7 leads in a case and was completing his shift when he volunteered to 8 investigate a domestic violence incident; on reaching the scene he 9 gave pursuit to the suspect, and in the course of an ensuing gun 10 battle he was mortally wounded; and

11 WHEREAS, A member of the Dallas police force since 2001, 12 Officer Jackson served as a liaison between central patrol and the 13 department's gang unit; he also served as a student resource 14 officer at Lake Highlands Junior High School; and

WHEREAS, This outstanding law officer was greatly respected by his colleagues for the passion and dedication he brought to his work, as well as for his proficiency at his job and his desire to help in whatever way he might be able; his concern for others expressed itself in many ways, as in the helping hand he extended without fanfare to those in need; and

21 WHEREAS, The son of a U.S. Navy officer, Brian Jackson was 22 born in Honolulu, Hawaii, in 1976 and grew up on naval bases 23 overseas, as well as in California, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, 24 and Rhode Island; he was a varsity athlete at Portsmouth High School

in Rhode Island and a cheerleader at the University of Rhode Island, where he received a degree in sociology in 1999; and

3 WHEREAS, During his years in college, Officer Jackson became 4 certified as an Emergency Medical Technician and then volunteered 5 as an EMT with several organizations; he met JoAnn DeMello, a fellow 6 volunteer and URI student, while serving as an emergency responder, 7 and the couple married on the URI campus in August 2005; and

8 WHEREAS, After graduating from the university, Brian Jackson 9 pursued his dream of becoming a law officer and explored 10 opportunities around the country; ultimately, he turned down an 11 offer from the police force in New York City in order to join the 12 department in Dallas; and

13 WHEREAS, In recognition of his meritorious service, Officer 14 Jackson received numerous commendations, and his name has been 15 added to a memorial for emergency workers who have given their lives 16 while performing their duties; and

WHEREAS, Brian Jackson exemplified the qualities that 17 citizens in their law enforcement personnel--decency, 18 seek bravery, professionalism, and a steady resolve in the face of 19 danger; this courageous officer won the esteem and affection of the 20 individuals he worked with on the force and in the community, and 21 his memory will be forever cherished by those who were privileged to 22 23 share in the warmth of his love and friendship; now, therefore, be 24 it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas Legislature, 3rd Called Session, hereby pay special tribute to the memory of Officer Brian Howard Jackson and extend sincere sympathy
