## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The malignant consummation of centuries-old hatred and intolerance, the genocidal horror known as the Holocaust will forever stain the history of humankind; and

WHEREAS, The Holocaust was the state-sponsored, systematic persecution and annihilation of European Jewry by Nazi Germany and its collaborators between 1933 and 1945; during those years, six million Jews, the primary victims of the Holocaust, were murdered; and

WHEREAS, In addition, Romanies, the handicapped, and Poles were targeted for destruction or decimation for racial, ethnic, or national reasons; millions more, including homosexuals, Jehovah's Witnesses, Soviet prisoners of war, and political dissidents, also suffered grievous oppression and death under Nazi tyranny; and

WHEREAS, The history of the Holocaust offers an opportunity to reflect on the moral responsibilities of individuals, societies, and governments and on the need for respect for all peoples; and

WHEREAS, In 1980, the United States Congress created the United States Holocaust Memorial Council and charged it with leading nationwide Holocaust commemorations and educational programs; each year, the council designates an eight-day period as the Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust; this year, the Days of Remembrance are being observed from Sunday, April 23, 2006, through Sunday, April 30, 2006, a span that includes the

24 International Day of Remembrance, Yom Hashoah, on April 25; and
