WHEREAS, A committed civic leader, Mrs. Opryshek gave generously of her time and talents in behalf of her beloved hometown; at the time of her passing, she was a director of the Baytown Chamber of Commerce and a member of the city's Long Range Planning Commission; she had also served on the Steering Committee for the city's 2020 Comprehensive Plan Update and the Planning and Zoning Commission; a trusted advisor to a number of the city's mayors over the years, she also served as district coordinator for former U.S. Representative Nick Lampson; moreover, she was named Volunteer of the Year in 1999 by the chamber of commerce and in 2000 the Baytown Sun named her Citizen of the Year; and

WHEREAS, Her dedication to the community extended into many areas of advocacy; a great supporter of education, she served as
