WHEREAS, He had a distinguished career in higher education, serving as dean of the College of Education and professor at Grambling State University, dean of men and instructor of social science at Bishop College, director of Student Personnel and professor at Alcorn A&M University, coordinator of the Triple T Program at Texas Southern University, and visiting professor and research associate at the University of California; and

WHEREAS, In 1980, Dr. Berry was named president of his alma mater, Jarvis Christian College; this much-admired leader contributed immeasurably to the development of the school, and during his eight-year tenure, he oversaw increased enrollment, expansion of the scholarship program, and numerous construction projects, including the J. N. Ervin Religion and Culture Center, two modern residence halls, and a 12-unit student/parent apartment complex; moreover, the college received full title to all assets
