

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, The knowledge that their homes and families are  
2 being lovingly cared for in their absence offers soldiers  
3 immeasurable comfort and solace, and for more than a year, while  
4 Corporal Johnathan Hicks was serving his country as part of the 2nd  
5 Battalion, 112th Armor Regiment, 56th Brigade Combat Team of the  
6 36th Infantry Division in Iraq, his wife, Ronda Hicks, was  
7 sustaining their North Texas household; and

8           WHEREAS, With remarkable perseverance and courage, this  
9 esteemed Texan successfully shouldered responsibilities alone that  
10 had once been shared; indeed, without the assistance of her spouse,  
11 the burden of managing the home was sometimes great and Mrs. Hicks  
12 must have often felt the painful ache of separation particularly  
13 familiar to wives of servicemen; and

14           WHEREAS, Difficult times are frequently eased by crucial  
15 connections with others, and Mrs. Hicks was part of a caring and  
16 helpful community of women whose husbands were deployed with one  
17 another; reaching out to each other in times of need, the women  
18 provided an important source of empathy and encouragement; never  
19 losing sight of what bound them together, they organized  
20 fund-raising efforts to purchase and send supplies to their men in  
21 Iraq; and

22           WHEREAS, Throughout history women have been an integral part  
23 of wartime endeavors, whether as soldiers themselves, nurses,  
24 factory workers, or loved ones offering their spouses a vital link

1 home, and in her steadfast attention to domestic duties while her  
2 husband was stationed in Iraq, Ronda Hicks has earned a place in  
3 this most respected legacy; now, therefore, be it

4       RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas  
5 Legislature, 3rd Called Session, hereby honor Ronda Hicks for her  
6 dedicated and resolute support of the household during the  
7 deployment of her husband, Corporal Johnathan Hicks, in Iraq and  
8 extend to both of them sincere best wishes for a prosperous and
