## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The year 2005 marked the retirement of U.S. Army 2 Chaplain Colonel Edward K. Maney, who concluded a distinguished 3 career in the military that spanned 28 years; and

WHEREAS, A San Antonio native and 1975 graduate of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, Chaplain Maney served seven years as an officer in the air defense artillery before resigning his commission to pursue his seminary education; after receiving his master of divinity degree from the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in December 1984, he returned to active duty in January 1985 at Fort Bliss; and

WHEREAS, Beginning in July 2002, Chaplain Maney served as the installation chaplain of U.S. Army Garrison Fort Sam Houston; before assuming that post, he served with distinction as the command chaplain of the 19th Theater Support Command in Taegu, Korea, from June 2000 to July 2002; and

WHEREAS, His sterling military career has included assignment in Germany as brigade chaplain for the 17th Field Artillery Brigade as well as a year of advanced civilian study at Princeton Theological Seminary before his assignment as a U.S. Army Command and General Staff College instructor; he received a master of theology degree in world religions and cultural foundations from Princeton University in June 1992 and was a subject-matter expert for the U.S. Army chaplaincy on world religions and cultural foundations; and
