1           WHEREAS, The passing of Bobby Jack Probst of Alpine has left a  
2 void in the lives of his family members and many friends, yet his  
3 legacy of success and achievement will be remembered for years to  
4 come; and

5           WHEREAS, Born in San Angelo on September 23, 1939, this  
6 lifelong Texan graduated from Kermit High School in 1958; he played  
7 quarterback for the Yellowjacket football team and was proud of the  
8 fact that he maintained his friendships with many of his high school  
9 teammates; and

10           WHEREAS, After pursuing his football career at The University  
11 of Texas, San Angelo Junior College, Denver University, Trinity  
12 University, and Sul Ross State University, he earned a bachelor's  
13 degree from the latter and went on to gain a master's degree in  
14 counseling and administration; and

15           WHEREAS, Coach Probst was a dedicated educator who excelled  
16 as a teacher, coach, counselor, and administrator during his  
17 impressive career; he established a number of golf programs at  
18 schools throughout the state and played a vital role in the  
19 construction of Terlingua's first high school while serving as  
20 superintendent of schools; notably, his Terlingua High School golf  
21 teams were once featured in *Golf and Leisure Magazine*; and

22           WHEREAS, An avid golfer himself, Coach Probst played with his  
23 friends at courses across the Lone Star State; his favorite  
24 partners, however, were his daughter, Jennifer, and his

1 granddaughter, K. C.; at the time of his passing, Coach Probst was  
2 serving on the board of directors at Alpine Country Club; and

3 WHEREAS, Bobby Jack Probst inspired countless individuals  
4 during his full and happy life, and although he no longer walks  
5 among us, his memory will continue to inspire those who were  
6 privileged to know him; now, therefore, be it

8 Legislature, 3rd Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the life of  
9 Bobby Jack Probst and extend deepest sympathy to the members of his
