

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, Family and friends are celebrating the life of  
2 Bennye Carol Frazier of San Antonio, who passed away on April 10,  
3 2006, at the age of 76; and

4           WHEREAS, Born in Johnson City on March 18, 1930, Mrs. Frazier  
5 earned a bachelor's degree from Incarnate Word College and a  
6 master's in educational psychology and guidance and counseling from  
7 The University of Texas at San Antonio; and

8           WHEREAS, A skilled and dedicated teacher, she worked with  
9 at-risk students enrolled in Coordinated Vocational Academic  
10 Education Cooperative; during a career that spanned nearly 30  
11 years, she taught at Churchill and Lanier High Schools; and

12           WHEREAS, Held in the highest regard by her colleagues, she  
13 became the first woman to serve as state president of the Texas  
14 Industrial Vocational Association, an organization composed  
15 overwhelmingly of men, and she also served two terms as president of  
16 the San Antonio Teachers Council; and

17           WHEREAS, Mrs. Frazier played an active role in the community,  
18 leading the San Antonio Calligraphers Guild for two years and  
19 devoting significant time and energy to groups concerned with  
20 heritage preservation; she served as president of the San Antonio  
21 Schools Archives Association, which has worked to preserve the  
22 history of education in San Antonio, and as president of the Harp  
23 and Shamrock Society, a group devoted to the celebration of Irish  
24 culture and Irish contributions to Texas; she also belonged to the

1 San Antonio Conservation Society and served as paper chair of A  
2 Night in Old San Antonio; and

3 WHEREAS, A stalwart of the Bexar County Democratic Party,  
4 Mrs. Frazier held the offices of chairman, secretary, and treasurer  
5 in that organization and also served on the State Democratic  
6 Executive Committee; over the years she helped numerous candidates,  
7 in races at every level, and in 2000 she cofounded a political  
8 action committee by the name of Wise Ol' Women (WOW); and

9 WHEREAS, Bennye Frazier brought to her many endeavors an  
10 unflinching integrity, purposefulness, and generosity of spirit that  
11 won her the affection and esteem of countless fellow citizens, and  
12 her memory will be forever cherished by all who were privileged to  
13 share in the richness of her life; now, therefore, be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas  
15 Legislature, 3rd Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the life of  
16 Bennye Carol Frazier and extend sincere sympathy to the members of
