## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, In 2001, Senator Barrientos received the first-ever Combined Law Enforcement of Texas Association of Texas Lifetime Achievement Award; a three-time Texas Public Employees Association Outstanding Legislator of the Year and recipient of the group's Lifetime Achievement Award, he is also the recipient of awards from the Austin Groups for the Elderly, MALDEF, the Coalition of Texans with Disabilities, as well as many other organizations; and
