RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Every 45 seconds, on average, someone in the United
States suffers from a stroke; in fact, each year about 700,000
Americans suffer a new or recurrent stroke; and

WHEREAS, These figures are especially alarming considering 4 5 that stroke is the third leading cause of death in the United States, ranking behind only diseases of the heart and cancer; in 6 2003, stroke accounted for one of every 15 deaths in the United 7 States, and in 2002, Texas ranked 13th among the states with the 8 highest age-adjusted stroke 9 death rates, with a rate of approximately 62.5 deaths per 100,000 in population; and 10

11 WHEREAS, Even for those who survive an initial stroke, the 12 aftermath poses serious risk of recurrence, and recovery is 13 difficult; 22 percent of men and 25 percent of women who have an 14 initial stroke die within a year, and stroke is the leading cause of 15 serious, long-term disability in the United States; and

16 WHEREAS, Regrettably, certain ethnic groups are more likely 17 to suffer from stroke than others; African Americans generally have 18 almost twice the risk of first-ever stroke compared with white 19 Americans, and African Americans between the ages of 35 and 54 have 20 four times the relative risk for stroke; and

21 WHEREAS, Despite the prevalence and serious consequences of 22 stroke, the majority of Americans are not aware of their risk 23 factors for a stroke, nor are they aware of the signs and symptoms 24 of an impending stroke, such as sudden numbness or weakness of the

1 face, arm, or leg; sudden trouble speaking or seeing in one or both 2 eyes; sudden dizziness or loss of balance and coordination; and 3 sudden severe headache; and

WHEREAS, In an effort to address these issues, in November 2005, the American Stroke Association launched its "Power to End Stroke" campaign aimed at educating the African American community on how to reduce the chances of having a stroke, recognizing the symptoms of stroke, and responding to the warning signs that a person is suffering or has suffered from a stroke; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas Legislature, 3rd Called Session, express its support for the American Stroke Association's "Power to End Stroke" campaign.
