WHEREAS, His love of justice joined with the love of his home state in his work as the head of the Fort Worth Human Relations Commission and in his essential contributions to the passage of the Texas Fair Housing Act and the Texas Commission on Human Rights Act; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hale was a fitting choice to serve as the first executive director of the Texas Human Rights Commission, a post he held for 17 years, and he brought to this demanding and worthwhile work his characteristic energy and intelligence; and

WHEREAS, Dedicated to the cause that shaped the course of his life, he also served as chair of the Austin Human Rights Commission and as president of the International Association of Official Human Rights Agencies; and

WHEREAS, Though at the center of public events for many years, Mr. Hale was also a devoted family man, and his public persona as a relentless seeker of justice is complemented by his
