1 WHEREAS, The Honorable Suzanna Gratia Hupp is retiring from
2 the Texas House of Representatives following a distinguished
3 11-year tenure, and this occasion offers a fitting opportunity to
4 recognize her service as a member of the Texas Legislature; and

5 WHEREAS, Elected in a special election on November 4, 1996,
6 Representative Hupp was sworn in on November 15 of that same year,
7 just before the start of the 74th Regular Session; and

8 WHEREAS, Representative Hupp's legislative career has
9 included membership on the Appropriations Subcommittee on Health
10 and Human Services, the House Committees on Corrections,
11 Agriculture and Livestock, and Public Safety, the Calendars
12 Committee, and the House Select Committee on Elections; moreover,
13 she has chaired the House Committees on Law Enforcement and Human
14 Services, as well as the Select Committee on Child Welfare and
15 Foster Care; and

16 WHEREAS, A member of the House Rural Caucus and the House
17 Veterans and Military Affairs Caucus, she has been recognized for
18 her achievements by the American Family Association, the Free
19 Market Foundation, the Texas Association of Business and Chambers
20 of Commerce, the Texas Alliance for Life, the Texas Eagle Forum, and
21 the Young Conservatives of Texas; and

22 WHEREAS, Representative Hupp's retirement will undoubtedly
23 afford her the opportunity to spend more time with her husband,
24 Greg, and their two young children, Alexander and Ethan, on the
