A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment dedicating certain increases
- 2 in state tax revenue to public education.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 3, Article VII, Texas Constitution, is
- 5 amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 6 (f) In any state fiscal year, the following state tax
- 7 revenues may be used only for purposes related to public education
- 8 <u>as provided by the legislature:</u>
- 9 (1) increases in revenue from the state franchise tax
- 10 that are attributable to the changes in law made by H.B. No. 3, Acts
- 11 of the 79th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, 2006, or similar
- 12 legislation that revises the state franchise tax;
- 13 (2) increases in revenue from state motor vehicle
- sales and use taxes that are attributable to H.B. No. 4, Acts of the
- 15 79th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, 2006, or similar legislation
- that revises the state motor vehicle sales and use taxes; and
- 17 (3) increases in revenue from the state taxes imposed
- 18 on the sale of cigarettes and other tobacco products that are
- 19 attributable to the changes in law made by H.B. No. 5, Acts of the
- 20 79th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, 2006, or similar legislation
- 21 that increases the rate of the state tax imposed on the sale of
- 22 cigarettes or the rate of the state tax imposed on the sale of other
- 23 tobacco products.
- 24 SECTION 2. The following temporary provision is added to

- 1 the Texas Constitution:
- 2 TEMPORARY PROVISION. (a) This temporary provision applies
- 3 to the constitutional amendment proposed by the 79th Legislature,
- 4 3rd Called Session, 2006, dedicating increases in certain state tax
- 5 revenues attributable to certain Acts of the 79th Legislature, 3rd
- 6 Called Session, 2006, to public education.
- 7 (b) The amendment to Section 3, Article VII, of this
- 8 Constitution takes effect September 1, 2007, and applies only to
- 9 state tax revenues that are collected on or after that date.
- 10 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 11 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 7, 2006,
- but only if House Bill No. 3, 4, or 5, Acts of the 79th Legislature,
- 13 3rd Called Session, 2006, or similar legislation, is enacted and
- 14 becomes law. If none of those Acts and no other similar legislation
- 15 becomes law, this proposed constitutional amendment shall not be
- 16 submitted to the voters. If this proposed constitutional amendment
- is submitted to the voters, the ballot for the election shall be
- 18 printed to permit voting for or against the proposition: "The
- 19 constitutional amendment dedicating certain increases in revenues
- 20 from franchise taxes, motor vehicle sales and use taxes, and taxes
- on cigarettes and other tobacco products to public education."
