**WHEREAS**, Born in El Salvador, Mrs. Schotz moved to Mexico at the age of 20, and on April 8, 1923, she married Henry Hans Schotz, a metallurgical engineer with the American Smelting and Refining Company; and

**WHEREAS**, The couple lived in several mining camps throughout Mexico, and they had seven children; Mrs. Schotz was an excellent seamstress, and she created many costumes for school theatrical productions; and

**WHEREAS**, Mrs. Schotz moved to Austin in 1946 after her husband died; she later became the first resident of the Rebecca Baines Johnson Retirement Center; and

**WHEREAS**, A woman of courage, strength, and generosity, Mrs. Schotz enriched all who knew her with her love and compassion, her warmth and kindness, and her enthusiasm and vitality; and

**WHEREAS**, Mrs. Schotz was a devoted mother and grandmother, and she leaves behind memories that will be cherished forever by her family and many friends; now, therefore, be it
