WHEREAS, The family moved to Plano in 1972, and there Jackie dedicated herself to raising her children; she later showed that same dedication for more than three decades in working for the political community of Collin County; and

WHEREAS, Jackie Schnittker was a caring and generous woman who enriched the lives of all who knew her with her love and compassion, her warmth and kindness, and her enthusiasm for living each day to the fullest; and

WHEREAS, She was a devoted mother and grandmother, and she leaves behind memories that will be treasured forever by her family and many friends; now, therefore, be it
