## In Memory of James Douglas Shear, Jr.

WHEREAS, He was born in Fort Worth on July 27, 1952, and he was an alumnus of Fort Worth's Paschal High School; he moved to Austin in 1970 to attend The University of Texas, and his love of politics and interest in government led him to a part-time job with Secretary of State Bob Bullock; he would have a 30-year working relationship with Bob Bullock, especially on issues pertaining to funding for education; and

WHEREAS, In 1984, he was selected to head the comptroller's fiscal research staff in devising new finance solutions as part of the Select Committee on Public Education chaired by H. Ross Perot; and

WHEREAS, After leaving state service in 1989, he joined the law firm that is now Ray, Wood, and Bonilla as director of client services; he was also a tax policy consultant and legislative liaison for the Equity Center and the Texas Association of School Boards; in June, 2002, he was a recipient of the Champions of Equity Award from the Equity Center for his commitment to quality and equity in Texas public education; and

WHEREAS, Jim Shear, through his intellect, his steadfast dedication, his perseverance, and his hard work, had a long-lasting impact on the educational system of this state; and

WHEREAS, He was a devoted father, son, and brother, and he leaves behind memories that will be treasured forever by his family and many friends; now, therefore, be it
