1-7 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-8 AN ACT

1-9 relating to the persons who may inspect or obtain a copy of a
1-10 military discharge record under the public information law.

1-11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-12 SECTION 1. Section 552.140(c), Government Code, is amended
1-13 to read as follows:

1-14 (c) On request and the presentation of proper
1-15 identification, the following persons may inspect the military
1-16 discharge record or obtain from the governmental body free of
1-17 charge a copy or certified copy of the record:

1-18 (1) the veteran who is the subject of the record;

1-19 (2) the legal guardian of the veteran;

1-20 (3) the spouse or a child or parent of the veteran or,
1-21 if there is no living spouse, child, or parent, the nearest living
1-22 relative of the veteran;

1-23 (4) the personal representative of the estate of the
1-24 veteran;

1-25 (5) the person named by the veteran, or by a person
1-26 described by Subdivision (2), (3), or (4), in an appropriate power
1-27 of attorney executed in accordance with Section 490, Chapter XII,
1-28 Texas Probate Code; ~~or~~

1-29 (6) another governmental body; or

1-30 (7) an authorized representative of the funeral home
1-31 that assists with the burial of the veteran.

1-32 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-33 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-34 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-35 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-36 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
1-37 legislative session.

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
