A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the sale or service of an alcoholic beverage to a person 3 on the person's 21st birthday; providing a penalty. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 106, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended 5 6 by adding Section 106.031 to read as follows: Sec. 106.031. SALE OR SERVICE OF ALCOHOL TO PERSON ON 7 PERSON'S 21ST BIRTHDAY. (a) The holder of a license or permit that 8 9 allows the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption commits an offense if, on the licensed or permitted premises, the 10 11 license or permit holder with criminal negligence sells, serves, 12 dispenses, or delivers an alcoholic beverage to a person on the date of the person's 21st birthday before: 13 14 (1) 7 a.m. if the person's birthday occurs on a day other than Sunday; or 15 16 (2) noon if the person's birthday occurs on Sunday. (b) A license or permit holder who sells, serves, dispenses, 17 or delivers an alcoholic beverage to a person on the person's 21st 18 birthday before the time prescribed by Subsection (a) does not 19 commit an offense if the person falsely represents that the 20 21 person's 21st birthday occurred on a date before the date on which 22 the sale or service occurs by displaying an apparently valid Texas 23 driver's license or identification card issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety containing a physical description 24

1 consistent with the person's appearance for the purpose of inducing 2 the license or permit holder to sell or serve the person an 3 alcoholic beverage. 4 (c) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.

5 SECTION 2. Section 106.13(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:

Except as provided in Subsections (b) and (c) [of this 7 (a) 8 section], the commission or administrator may cancel or suspend for 9 not more than 90 days a retail license or permit or a private club registration permit if it is found, on notice and hearing, that the 10 licensee or permittee with criminal negligence sold, served, 11 dispensed, or delivered an alcoholic beverage to a minor, sold, 12 served, dispensed, or delivered an alcoholic beverage to a person 13 14 21 years of age earlier than the time prescribed by Section 106.031, 15 or with criminal negligence permitted a minor to violate Section 106.04 or 106.05 [of this code] on the licensed premises. 16

SECTION 3. Section 106.14(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended to read as follows:

For purposes of this chapter and any other provision of 19 (a) this code relating to the sales, service, dispensing, or delivery 20 21 of alcoholic beverages to a person who is not a member of a private club on the club premises, a minor, a person who is 21 years of age 22 on the person's 21st birthday, or an intoxicated person or the 23 24 consumption of alcoholic beverages by a person who is not a member of a private club on the club premises, a minor, or an intoxicated 25 26 person, the actions of an employee shall not be attributable to the 27 employer if:

(1) the employer requires its employees to attend a
commission-approved seller training program;
(2) the employee has actually attended such a training
program; and
(3) the employer has not directly or indirectly
encouraged the employee to violate such law.
SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
