- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 662, Government Code, is 4
- 5 amended by adding Section 662.051 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 662.051. WOMEN'S INDEPENDENCE DAY. (a) August 26 is
- Women's Independence Day to commemorate the ratification in 1920 of 7
- the Nineteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution, which 8
- 9 guaranteed women the right to vote.
- (b) Women's Independence Day shall be regularly observed by 10
- 11 appropriate programs in the public schools and other places to
- 12 inspire a greater appreciation of the importance of women's
- 13 suffrage.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15
- provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16
- Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 17
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
