- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 659.305(a)-(c), Government Code, are 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), the amount of a 8 full-time state employee's hazardous duty pay for a particular 9 month is the lesser of \$500 or:
- 10 (1) \$10 [\$7] for each 12-month period of lifetime
  11 service credit accrued by an [the] employee who has less than five
  12 years of lifetime service credit; [or]
- 13 (2) \$15 for each 12-month period of lifetime service

  14 credit accrued by an employee who has at least 5 years but less than

  15 10 years of lifetime service credit;
- 16 (3) \$20 for each 12-month period of lifetime service
  17 credit accrued by an employee who has at least 10 years but less
  18 than 15 years of lifetime service credit; or
- (4) \$25 for each 12-month period of lifetime service

  credit accrued by an employee who has 15 or more years of lifetime

  service credit [\$210].
- 22 (b) This subsection applies only to a state employee whose 23 compensation for services provided to the state during any month 24 before August 1987 included hazardous duty pay that was based on

- 1 total state service performed before May 29, 1987. The amount of a
- 2 full-time state employee's hazardous duty pay for a particular
- 3 month is the sum of:
- 4 (1) \$7 for each 12-month period of state service
- 5 credit the employee finished accruing before May 29, 1987; and
- 6 (2) an amount determined using the pay scale under
- 7 <u>Subsection (a)</u> [\$7] for each 12-month period of lifetime service
- 8 credit that the employee accrued on or after [the date, which must
- 9 be before] May 29, 1987 [, on which the employee finished accruing
- 10 the last 12-month period of state service credit].
- 11 (c) The amount determined under Subsection (b)(2) may not
