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	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to a pilot program designed to improve educational
3	services in participating school districts.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter J to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER J. STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT GUARANTEE IN
8	EDUCATION PILOT PROGRAM
9	Sec. 29.351. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "program"
10	means the student achievement guarantee in education pilot program
11	described by this subchapter.
12	Sec. 29.352. PROGRAM. (a) The program consists of a
13	contract between a school district and the agency in which the
14	district agrees to provide educational services as provided by
15	Section 29.356 in exchange for receiving funds under Section
16	29.357.
17	(b) The commissioner shall accept applications from
18	eligible school districts and select four districts for
19	participation in the program. The commissioner shall select
20	districts in a manner that ensures statewide geographic
21	representation.
22	Sec. 29.353. RULES. The commissioner shall adopt rules to
23	administer the program.
24	Sec. 29.354. ELIGIBILITY. (a) A school district is

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1	eligible to participate in the program if, during the school year
2	preceding the year in which the district applies for participation,
3	50 percent or more of the students enrolled at an elementary school
4	campus in the district were educationally disadvantaged students.
5	(b) An elementary school campus is eligible to receive funds
6	under Section 29.357 if, during the school year preceding the year
7	of participation in the program, 50 percent or more of the students
8	enrolled at the campus were educationally disadvantaged students.
9	Sec. 29.355. CONTRACT. A contract between a school
10	district and the agency for participation in the program must
11	include:
12	(1) a description of each elementary school campus in
13	the district to receive funds under Section 29.357;
14	(2) the district's plan to implement the requirements
15	of Section 29.356;
16	(3) a method for evaluating the academic achievement
17	of students enrolled at each campus participating in the program;
18	(4) any proposed performance objectives under the
19	program, including:
20	(A) improvement of student performance on
21	assessment instruments administered under Section 39.023;
22	(B) professional development in the district;
23	(C) increased integration of students, parents,
24	and district residents in district decision-making; and
25	(D) proposed methods for attaining any
26	educational goals adopted by the district; and
27	(5) for each campus to receive funds under Section

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1	29.357, the district's proposed method of monitoring compliance
2	with the terms of the contract.
3	Sec. 29.356. PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS. (a) A school district
4	that participates in the program must implement the following
5	measures at each campus in the district that receives funds under
6	Section 29.357:
7	(1) in the first year, assign one additional
8	appropriately certified teacher to each kindergarten through third
9	grade class and maintain those assignments during each year that
10	the district participates in the program;
11	(2) open the campus for extended hours of operation as
12	necessary to meet the requirements of this section and as specified
13	in the contract;
14	(3) collaborate with community organizations to
15	increase the availability of educational and recreational
16	opportunities for all district residents;
17	(4) in cooperation with the agency, campus personnel,
18	and district residents, review the campus academic curriculum and
19	adopt a more rigorous curriculum designed to improve student
20	academic achievement;
21	(5) develop a program for new employees of the campus
22	designed to improve each employee's transition into the campus;
23	(6) increase the time provided by the campus for
24	employee collaboration and planning;
25	(7) require that each teacher and administrator submit
26	to the district a professional development plan that includes
27	methods for:

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1	(A) improving student academic achievement; and
2	(B) evaluating the success of the plan;
3	(8) evaluate each teacher and administrator,
4	including:
5	(A) evaluation of the effectiveness of each
6	professional development plan submitted under Subdivision (7); and
7	(B) identification of areas of strength and
8	weakness;
9	(9) provide a support system designed to improve the
10	performance of teachers and administrators, including:
11	(A) specific documentation of the performance of
12	teachers and administrators; and
13	(B) a method of receiving suggested revisions to
14	the evaluation process, including comments and contributions from
15	teachers and administrators; and
16	(10) dismiss any teacher or administrator whose
17	performance fails to improve, as documented under Subdivision
18	(9)(A) and as determined by the district.
19	(b) The requirements of Subsection (a) are in addition to
20	any other requirements of this code.
21	Sec. 29.357. FUNDS. (a) From funds appropriated for the
22	purpose, the commissioner shall pay to each school district that
23	has contracted with the agency under Section 29.355 an amount equal
24	to \$2,000 for each educationally disadvantaged student who is
25	enrolled:
26	(1) in a grade level designated in the contract; and
27	(2) at a campus designated in the contract.

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1	(b) The commissioner shall cease payment of funds to a
2	school district if the district withdraws from the contract before
3	the contract expires.
4	(c) Funds a district receives under this section are in
5	addition to funds received under Chapter 42. Section 42.258
6	applies to funds received under this section. The commissioner
7	shall distribute funds under this section in the manner provided by
8	Section 42.259.
9	(d) If funds appropriated for a school year for purposes of
10	this section are less than the amount to which school districts are
11	entitled under this section for that school year, the commissioner
12	shall reduce the amount distributed to each district
13	proportionately.
14	Sec. 29.358. USE OF FUNDS. (a) A school district or campus
15	participating in the program may use funds received under Section
16	29.357 only for the purposes of Section 29.356(a)(1).
17	(b) A school district must distribute funds received under
18	Section 29.357 to a campus designated in the contract under Section
19	29.355.
20	Sec. 29.359. PROGRAM REVIEW COMMITTEE; ANNUAL REVIEW. (a)
21	A program review committee is created for each school district
22	participating in the program. Each committee consists of:
23	(1) the commissioner;
24	(2) the presiding officers of the standing committees
25	of the senate and the house of representatives having jurisdiction
26	over public education;
27	(3) two representatives of the agency, appointed by

No. 238 1 the commissioner; 2 (4) the superintendent of the participating district; 3 and 4 (5) the principal of each campus in the district 5 receiving funds under Section 29.357. 6 (b) Not later than June 30 of each year, each committee 7 shall review the progress of each campus that receives funds under 8 Section 29.357. 9 (c) In addition to the committee review under this section, 10 the agency may provide for an annual independent evaluation of the 11 program. Sec. 29.360. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT. The agency may 12 terminate a contract under this subchapter at the end of a school 13 14 year if the agency determines that during that school year the 15 school district: (1) violated the terms of the contract under Section 16 17 29.355; or (2) failed to implement the requirements of Section 18 19 29.356. Sec. 29.361. EXPIRATION OF PROGRAM. This subchapter 20 21 expires August 31, 2015. SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2006, the commissioner 22 of education shall adopt rules for administration of the student 23 24 achievement guarantee in education pilot program under Subchapter J, Chapter 29, Education Code, as added by this Act. 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 27

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
