4	SECTION 1. Section 662.005(b), Government Code, is amended
5	to read as follows:
6	(b) Except as provided by Section 662.010, and
7	notwithstanding Section 659.015 or another law, each of the
8	following state employees [a state employee who is a peace officer
9	commissioned by a state officer or state agency listed under
10	Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or who is employed by the
11	Department of Public Safety to perform communications or dispatch
12	services related to traffic law enforcement and] who is required to
13	work on a national or state holiday that falls on a Saturday or
14	Sunday is entitled to compensatory time off at the rate of one hour
15	for each hour worked on the holiday:
16	(1) a state employee who is a peace officer
17	commissioned by a state officer or state agency listed under
18	Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure; and
19	(2) a person who is employed by the Department of
20	Public Safety:
21	(A) to perform communications or dispatch
22	services related to traffic law enforcement;
23	(B) as a commercial motor vehicle inspector; or
24	(C) as a commercial motor carrier investigator.
