A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to efficiently administering and electronically
- 3 monitoring certain veterans' and dependents' tuition exemptions at
- 4 institutions of higher education.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 54.203, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Subsections (h) and (i) to read as follows:
- 8 (h) The governing board of each institution of higher
- 9 education shall electronically report to the Texas Higher Education
- 10 Coordinating Board the information required by Section 61.0516
- 11 relating to each individual receiving an exemption from fees and
- 12 charges under Subsection (a) or (b). The institution shall report
- the information not later than December 31 of each year for the fall
- semester, May 31 of each year for the spring semester, and September
- 15 30 of each year for the summer session.
- 16 (i) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may adopt
- 17 rules to provide for the efficient and uniform application of this
- 18 <u>section.</u>
- 19 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 61.0516 to read as follows:
- Sec. 61.0516. ELECTRONIC SYSTEM TO MONITOR TUITION
- 22 EXEMPTIONS FOR VETERANS AND DEPENDENTS. The board shall develop a
- 23 system to electronically monitor the use of tuition exemptions
- 24 under Section 54.203. The system must allow the board to

- 1 electronically receive, for each semester, the following
- 2 information from institutions of higher education:
- 3 (1) the name of the institution;
- 4 (2) the name, identification number, and date of birth
- of each individual attending the institution and receiving benefits
- 6 for the semester under Section 54.203;
- 7 (3) for each individual receiving benefits, the number
- 8 of credit hours for which the individual received an exemption for
- 9 the semester;
- 10 (4) for each individual receiving benefits at the
- 11 institution during the semester, the total cumulative number of
- 12 credit hours for which the individual has received an exemption at
- 13 the institution; and
- 14 (5) any other information required by the board.
- SECTION 3. Not later than October 1, 2005, the Texas Higher
- 16 Education Coordinating Board shall develop the system required by
- 17 Section 61.0516, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
