- 10 of a computer or any other device, equipment, or software, to
- 11 remotely control the aiming and discharge of a firearm to hunt an
- 12 animal, including a bird.

- 15 (b) A person may not engage in computer-assisted remote
- 16 hunting or provide or operate facilities for computer-assisted
- 17 remote hunting if the animal being hunted is located in this state.
- (c) For purposes of this section, facilities for
- 19 computer-assisted remote hunting include real property and
- 20 improvements on the property associated with hunting, including
- 21 <u>hunting blinds</u>, offices, and rooms equipped to facilitate
- 22 computer-assisted remote hunting.
- 23 (d) A person who violates this section commits an offense
- 24 that is a Class C Parks and Wildlife Code misdemeanor, unless it is

- 1 shown at the trial of the defendant that the defendant has been
- 2 convicted one or more times before the trial date of a violation of
- 3 this section, in which case the offense is a Class B Parks and
- 4 Wildlife Code misdemeanor.
- 5 (e) It is an exception to the application of this section
- 6 that a person provides only:
- 7 (1) general-purpose equipment, including a computer,
- 8 camera, fencing, and building materials;
- 9 (2) general-purpose computer software including an
- 10 operating system and communications programs; or
- 11 (3) general telecommunications hardware or networking
- 12 services for computers, including adapters, modems, servers,
- 13 routers, and other facilities associated with Internet access.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
