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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to teacher certification in early childhood education.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 21.050, Education Code, is amended by 5 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read as 6 follows:

(b) The board may not require more than 18 semester credit 7 hours of education courses at the baccalaureate level for the 8 granting of a teaching certificate. The board shall provide for a 9 minimum number of semester credit hours of internship to be 10 included in the hours needed for certification. 11 The board may 12 propose rules requiring additional credit hours for certification 13 in bilingual education, English as a second language[, early 14 childhood education], or special education.

(d) The board shall propose rules requiring that any 15 certification in early childhood education, or in primary school 16 education combined with early childhood education, include a 17 18 minimum number of semester credit hours of education courses and internships emphasizing early childhood development. The rules 19 must allow comparable work experience with a child-care facility or 20 federal <u>Head Start program to satisfy the internship requirement</u> 21 under this subsection. In this subsection, "child-care facility" 22 23 has the meaning assigned by Section 42.002, Human Resources Code.

SECTION 2. The State Board for Educator Certification shall

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propose the rules required by Section 21.050(d), Education Code, as 1 added by this Act, not later than December 1, 2005. A rule proposed 2 3 by the State Board for Educator Certification under Section 4 21.050(d), Education Code, as added by this Act, applies only to early childhood education certification requirements for a person 5 6 who enrolls in an educator preparation program on or after the date the proposed rule takes effect as a rule of the board. 7 Early 8 childhood education certification requirements for a person who 9 enrolls in an educator preparation program before the date the proposed rule takes effect as a rule of the board are governed by 10 the applicable State Board for Educator Certification rule in 11 effect for that person immediately before the proposed rule takes 12 effect as a rule of the board. 13

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
