(c) <u>Except as provided by Subsection (f), in</u> [In] an
extended hours area, a person commits an offense if he consumes or
possesses with intent to consume an alcoholic beverage in a public
place at any time on Sunday between 2:15 a.m. and 12 noon and on any

1	other day between 2:15 a.m. and 7 a.m.
2	(f) A person who is a registered guest of a hotel may consume
3	or possess alcoholic beverages in the hotel bar on Sunday between
4	the hours of 1 a.m. and 12 noon and on any other day between the
5	hours of midnight and 7 a.m. if the hotel bar holds an all-night
6	hotel mixed beverage permit.
7	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
