10	Section 37.006(a)(2)(B) or 37.007(a)(2)(A) committed by another
11	student who, at the time the conduct occurred, was assigned to the
12	same campus as the victim; or
13	(2) a sibling of a student described by Subdivision
14	(1) who is assigned to the same campus as the student described by
15	Subdivision (1).
16	(b) On the request of a parent or other person with
17	authority to act on behalf of a student who is a victim or a victim's
18	sibling to whom this section applies, the board of trustees of the
19	school district shall transfer the victim or sibling to a district

- 8 (e) Section 25.034 does not apply to a transfer under this

- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
