(a) Campus peace officers commissioned by the 10 university have the same jurisdiction, powers, privileges, and 11 12 immunities as provided by Section 51.203. 13 (b) Subsection (a) does not in any manner limit or reduce 14 the jurisdiction, powers, privileges, and immunities provided by law for a law enforcement agency of the state or a political 15 subdivision of the state, including the City of Austin police 16 department, with territorial jurisdiction that includes all or part 17 18 of the university campus. The law enforcement agency retains the autonomous authority to deploy agency personnel on university 19 property and in university facilities in any manner consistent with 20 the jurisdiction, powers, privileges, and immunities of the agency. 21
