A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating	to	the	creation	of	а	commission	to	study	capital

- 2 relating to the creation of a commission to study capital grant and a punishment in Texas.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 37, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 6 amended by adding Article 37.15 to read as follows:
- 7 Art. 37.15. TEXAS CAPITAL PUNISHMENT COMMISSION
- 8 Sec. 1. CREATION. The Texas Capital Punishment Commission
- 9 is created.

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- 10 Sec. 2. DUTIES. (a) The commission shall study capital
- 11 punishment in this state, concentrating particularly on:
- (1) addressing issues related to the legal
- 13 representation of indigent inmates in capital cases;
- 14 (2) identifying aspects of the capital punishment
- process that need improving, if any, including the manner in which
- 16 law enforcement agencies and the criminal justice system in this
- 17 state investigate, prosecute, and handle appeals of capital cases
- 18 and the ability of new technologies, including DNA testing, to
- 19 <u>increase the reliability of convictions in capital cases; and</u>
- 20 <u>(3) establishing safeguards that ensure that law</u>
- 21 enforcement agencies and the criminal justice system in this state
- 22 fairly and accurately investigate, prosecute, and handle appeals of
- 23 capital cases.
- 24 (b) In conducting the study under Subsection (a), the

- 1 commission may use the American Bar Association protocol, Death
- 2 Without Justice: A Guide for Examining the Administration of the
- 3 Death Penalty.
- 4 (c) After completing the study, the commission shall
- 5 propose legislation to correct any inequities in the capital
- 6 punishment process in this state. Legislation proposed under this
- 7 <u>subsection must be designed to ensure that the application and</u>
- 8 administration of capital punishment in this state is just, fair,
- 9 and accurate.
- Sec. 3. COMPOSITION. (a) The commission is composed of the
- 11 following 11 members:
- 12 (1) the executive director of the Texas District and
- 13 County Attorneys Association or the executive director's designee;
- 14 (2) the executive director of the Texas Criminal
- Defense Lawyers Association or the executive director's designee;
- 16 (3) the executive director of Justice for All or the
- 17 executive director's designee;
- 18 (4) the executive director of Murder Victims' Families
- 19 for Reconciliation or the executive director's designee;
- 20 (5) two members appointed by the governor;
- 21 (6) two members appointed by the lieutenant governor,
- 22 one of whom must be a former appellate level judge recommended by
- 23 the Texas Judicial Council;
- 24 (7) one member appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 25 representatives;
- 26 (8) one member appointed by the dean of the law school
- 27 at The University of Texas at Austin; and

- 1 (9) one member appointed by the dean of the law school
- 2 at Texas Tech University.
- 3 (b) Each member of the commission must be generally
- 4 experienced in criminal justice matters.
- 5 (c) Each appointed member serves at the pleasure of the
- 6 official by whom the member is appointed.
- 7 <u>(d) The governor shall designate a member to serve as</u>
- 8 presiding officer.
- 9 Sec. 4. REIMBURSEMENT. A member of the commission may not
- 10 receive compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for the
- 11 member's travel expenses as provided by Chapter 660, Government
- 12 Code, and the General Appropriations Act.
- Sec. 5. ASSISTANCE. The Texas Legislative Council and the
- 14 Legislative Budget Board shall assist the commission in performing
- 15 the commission's duties.
- Sec. 6. SUBMISSION. The commission shall submit the
- 17 proposed legislation described by Section 2(c) to the lieutenant
- 18 governor and the speaker of the house of representatives not later
- 19 than January 1, 2007.
- Sec. 7. INITIAL APPOINTMENTS. The governor, lieutenant
- 21 governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and the deans of
- the law schools at The University of Texas at Austin and Texas Tech
- 23 University shall make the appointments to the commission not later
- than the 31st day after the effective date of this article.
- Sec. 8. OTHER LAW. The commission is not subject to Chapter
- 26 2110, Government Code.
- Sec. 9. ABOLITION. The commission is abolished on January

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- 1 $\frac{1,2007}{1}$, and this article expires on that date.
- 2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
