- 5 SECTION 1. Section 502.409, Transportation Code, is amended

- 8 (a) A person commits an offense if the person attaches to or
- 9 displays on a motor vehicle a number plate or registration insignia

- only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 17 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before
- 18 the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs
- 19 before that date.
- 20 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 21 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 22 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
